New Arts Multimedia Language Learning Centre proposal

How can the way that we teach languages benefit from leading-edge technologies and the latest advancements in classroom design? The AMLF is slated to vacate its current premises in the basement of the McLennan Library Buildingmoving to Wilson Hall in the summer of 2018. With this change comes a rare opportunity to re-imagine and re-design our entire facility from the ground up so as to make language learning at McGill a unique experience. To that end, the AMLF working group has been convened, bringing the various language departments together to examine key issues transforming teaching and learning at the university level.

New equipment for instructors

The AMLF has acquired some new equipment for language instructors who create audio-visual materials for their classes:

- One high-quality still camera with tripod (also takes video)
- One high-quality microphone with pop filter and acoustic enclosure

- Avid Media Composer professional video editing software
- Avid Pro Tools professional sound recording and editing software
- Adobe CS6 Master Collection, including Photoshop, Adobe Acrobat Professional and InDesign (and many others)
- One powerful laptop on which to run the software, including a large external monitor and good quality speakers

Tutorials for these new tools will be prepared by the end of the year. If you already have a project you'd like to get started on, however, please get in touch with Michael Butler so that we can start with tutorials that are relevant to the tools that you will be using.

Ongoing research into new tools

On June 11th, a Sanako representative showed us the Study 1200 multimedia suite and Pronounce, which the literature describes as "an easy solution for improving oral skills in a foreign language". We have been given one 90-day license for Pronounce to try out with French, Spanish, and Russian voices. Please contact Michael Butler if you are interested in a demonstration.

On September 24th, a representative from WebSwami presented their product, and the feedback so far has been encouraging. Those in attendance appreciated the ability to incorporate video via webcam, platform independence, and the potential for integration with myCourses (D2L). We will keep you posted as we investigate this product further.

Other products we are looking at include ReLANpro, Robotel and Learning Branch, and we will keep you apprised of our findings.
