Message from the Director

Dear colleagues,

Now that the winter 2016 semester is almost over, it is time to look back at a busy, very productive, and exciting year at the AMLF, share with you our accomplishments, and inform you about our initiatives and new projects planned for the upcoming summer

This year, we are celebrating two important milestones for our lab: the very first language learning tools workshop for McGill students, and the launch of a new series of professional development events in Language Learning and Technology for second/foreign language instructors. These events were a great opportunity to collaborate with McGill student organizations, such as the McGill International Students Network (MISN) and Lingobuddies, and with different language departments both here at the Faculty of Arts and from other universities and schools. They gave us a better understanding of our users' needs and goals in terms of their language learning and teaching, made us rethink our mission, and gave us ideas about how to better support them in achieving their goals.

While we've accomplished a lot in the first few months of 2016, we have much more work ahead of us. Over the next few months, the AMLF physical space will be redesigned, creating two additional rooms for small group activities and informal meetings. Our hope is that these new spaces will provide increased opportunities for users to interact in the wide variety of languages that they learn here at McGill. In addition, we will share our research on Web 2.0 tools and applications on the AMLF website and create more workshops and training materials for both students and faculty. It is important to mention that these initiatives wouldn't be possible without the generous financial support of the Arts Undergraduate Society (AUS), to whom we are very grateful.

Finally, at the end of this newsletter, we suggest some readings and professional development opportunities that might give you new ideas about smart integration of technology in your classroom.

Language Learning Tools Workshops for Students



This year, the AMLF offered its **first Language Learning Tools Workshop** for McGill students. This event was organized in collaboration with *LingoBuddies*, the McGill International Student Network's peer to peer language exchange service, and

attracted 25 students from different faculties and schools.

The workshop was prepared and animated by our lab assistants Roman Celac, Thomas Tendron, and JbNam. The participants learned about and got the chance to try various web 2.0 tools and mobile applications for second/foreign language learning.



In the near future, we are planning to offer more language-specific workshops and other language practice activities such as conversation groups and consultations. Let us know if your department is interested in helping us to organize such activities.

On March 11th, Bill Wang from the Department of East Asian Studies presented a research talk entitled "The media and the message: what does educational technology mean to us, the language teaching community?"




