DESCRIPTION OF HOST	Casa-Pueblito is a non-profit, international organization that facilitates community
ORGANIZATION:	development and intercultural learning with a focus on youth in Canada and Latin America.
INTERN'S DUTIES AND	July 19, 2019 is the 40 th anniversary of the Nicaraguan revolution and much has changed
RESPONSIBILITIES:	since that time; as many people in our community say, today's Sandinistas aren't the same.
	Every year on July 19 our organization hosts a Film Night event to present a screening of a movie, followed by a panel with subject matter experts, that is relevant to Latin American development and the issues we work to address. The July 19, 2019 event will be an especially important year to build awareness about Nicaragua, what has happened in the past and the current issues today. This is an open, creative space to address complex issues with a potentially wide range of opinions. The intern for this role will develop a plan and materials with our team to relay knowledge to share with the event participants and the wider public, in the media platforms / website leading up to the July 2019 event and at the July 2019 event.
	The intern will also develop a plan to engage young people in this event and implement this plan through outreach activities such as connecting with youth-based organizations with a focus on social justice.
	This is not an events coordinator role. This is a knowledge development role for key content to be used at this event, and for engaging key audiences – including youth – to build awareness and knowledge on important issues.
	Interns' duties and projects may not be as listed. These will depend on the needs of the host organization.

It is up to the student to fully assess and prepare for any health or security risks that may be involved in pursuing this internship. Applicants are encouraged to discuss potential risks with their family prior to applying. Applicants must ensure that they are physically and mentally capable of successfully completing an internship in the internship host country. The Arts Internship Office may request a doctor's attestation that an applicant is sufficiently healthy to complete an internship.
ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:	Interns are responsible for informing themselves of what entry requirements are required to visit and work as an intern in the internship host country. These may include a visa, work permit, passport valid for at least 6 months after entry, and proof of certain vaccinations. The intern is responsible for acquiring all necessary documents in time for the beginning of their internship.

Only short-listed candidates will be contacted. At that time, you may be asked to come in for an interview.

The Arts Internship Office will then transmit the selected applications to the host organization, which will ultimately be responsible for the selection of the candidate(s).

If you feel you have experienced barriers which have had an impact on your academic performance and wish to highlight these to the selection committee, the documents/comments will be taken into consideration
