

Stantec/McIntosh Engineering Scholarships

Application Procedures

To initially obtain a scholarship, student candidates who are permanent residents of Canada and entering the 2nd year of a mining engineering program or equivalent stream must submit a package by October 15, including:

- 1) the completed application form;
- 2) an official transcript of their previous year's academic studies;
- 3) a brief resume of past education and work experience;
- 4) a letter of support from one of their current or previous instructors;
- 5) a confirmation that the student is enrolled in a mining engineering program; and
- 6) a short essay on what attracted him/her to the mining industry and what the applicant will do in the industry. The essay should also be forwarded by email to: (dsauve@cim.org) in a "Word" format.

All of this information will be considered by the CIMF Scholarship Committee when they make their selections. While academic achievement is important, submissions by successful candidates will document and exhibit keen interest in the minerals industry, will focus on facing challenges and problem solving, will demonstrate innovative work within organized teams and team building, as well as be sensitive and responsive to the needs of the community.

Eight scholarships are to be awarded annually.

All qualifying scholarship applicants will receive a complimentary CIM student membership.
