Christina Wolfson, PhD

Dr. Christina Wolfson received her BSc in Mathematics, MSc in Mathematical Statistics and PhD in Epidemiology & Biostatistics from McGill University and is currently Professor in the Department of Medicine and in the Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics and Occupational Health at McGill University. She is an Associate Member in the Departments of Neurology & Neurosurgery and the Department of Mathematics & Statistics at McGill University. Her program of research lies in population-based research in neurodegenerative disorders including multiple sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, and epilepsy. She is co-Principal investigator on the Canadian Longitudinal Study on Aging, a 20-year study of 50,000 participants aged 45-85 in which she leads the Neurological Conditions Initiative and the Veterans' Health Initiative and is the Director of the CLSA Statistical Analysis Centre. Dr. Wolfson is also co-principal investigator on a 5-country MS risk factor study (Environmental Risk Factors in Multiple Sclerosis - EnvIMS) recently completed in Italy, Norway, Serbia, Sweden and Canada.
