

Department of Family Medicine Presents:

Portrait of a primary care waiting room over time: Implications for practice redesign

Dr. Jeannie Haggerty, PhD., McGill University.

We recruited almost 1000 patients aged 25 to 75 years, representing one-week of waiting rooms in 12 clinics within four health networks in Quebec to follow their healthcare experience and health trajectory over time. Patients responded to 3 annual self-administered questionnaires. We found that multimorbidity is the norm for adult primary care patients, that there is an important unmet need for lifestyle modification, and that there are persistent problems with healthcare accessibility. We identified six clusters of functional health trajectories over time. The presentation will present some of the implications of these findings for practice redesign.
