- *What are projected **supply-demand dynamics & price** projections for Quebec's market?*
- *What is the state of play in the **EU Emissions Trading Scheme (EU ETS)**? How is the EU planning to treat the **aviation sector**?*
- *What policy is guiding **Canadian airlines**?*
- *What role do **registries/exchanges** play in carbon market operation & oversight? What lessons can be learned from the EU experience? Where might registries /exchanges fit into aviation sector proposals?*
- *What **legal issues** arise in tackling aviation emissions, and how might **future scenarios** play out in Canada and abroad?*
