

Where can you go?



Semester Dates: When can you go?

While many of our French and UK partners run on a semester schedule that is similar to McGill, the dates may overlap with multiple McGill semesters (for example, the Fall examination period for a host institution may occur in January). It is your responsibility to verify these important dates and to plan accordingly.



Things to Consider

Language of Instruction

United Kingdom

Classes are taught primarily in English at all of our partner institutions in the United Kingdom.

Proof of English Proficiency

Because the language of instruction at McGill is English, all outgoing students are exempt from having to prove English proficiency when applying to the host institution.

France

While some of our French partners offer courses taught in English, please be advised that – if you don't speak French - course offerings may be quite limited. Always consult the host's course catalogue!

Proof of French Proficiency

Demonstrating French proficiency could come in the form of:

- Successful completion of intermediate French at the college-level
- You graduated from a secondary or post-secondary institution where the language of instruction was French.
- A letter from a McGill professor capable of assessing your level of proficiency in French.

The Host Application: England + France

I've accepted my nomination to a partner school located in England + France; what documents will I need to apply to the host institution? Are there any supporting documents that I should prepare well in advance?

Documents to Prepare in Advance: England + France

- A Valid Passport
 - Most exchange partners in this region will request a scanned copy of your passport *before* reviewing your application. Your passport **must** be valid for at least six months after your scheduled return. If your passport is expiring soon, think about renewing it.
 - Reference Letter
 - Many of our French/UK partners will ask that you submit one or more letters of reference (from a McGill professor) as part of your application. Asking a professor to write a reference letter can be daunting, so start thinking about who you might ask!
- Proof of French Proficiency (see above)

I've been accepted, what must I do before departure?

- Apply for any relevant immigration documents. For more information, consult:
