
Mission:

FMHS Code of Conduct update

- Last review conducted in June 2021
- Why now and not in 2026? (usual interval is 5 years max for review of such policies).
- Three main prompts:
 - 1. A need to update nomenclature changes in titles (Principal to President / same for French).
 - 2. Request to add a link to the guidelines related to the Code of Conduct in the Anatomy Lab
 - 3. Request to update University policies that had evolved in their title
- The review of the Code of Conduct noted the following additional areas for updates:
 - There was repetition in language that could be streamlined to make the document more concise.
 - Reassessment of the number of hyperlinks and removal of those not relevant for a Code of Conduct, such as the hyperlink to the Employee Assistance Program.
- Presented to the Deanery Executive Committee on September 12, 2024. No additional comments, motion was made to send to FC for approval.




