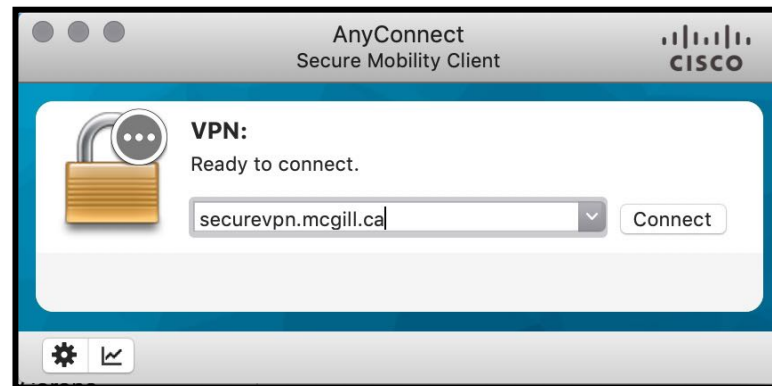
EZproxy
