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INTRODUCTION

- Transgender identity and homosexuality discussions has increased. However, LGBT equality are still not widely accepted worldwide.
- Culture dynamics^[1] and belief systems^[2] are important in predicting attitudes.
- We examined individuals' implicit and explicit attitudes towards transgender and gay people and compared the racial and religious differences.

CONCLUSION

- Religious values and race/ethnicity are associated with variations in attitudes about the gay and transgender population.
- White participants showed relatively lower levels of prejudices, and nonreligious people held the most positive transgender and sexuality attitudes.
- Promoting greater acceptance and inclusion of the LGBT community in religious contexts.

• Implicit Attitudes toward transgender people:





Figure 1. Transgender IAT^[3], a seven-block IAT N = 206,587




Figure 3 & 4. Implicit (left) and Explicit Attitudes (right) Towards Transgender People Across Racial Groups




Figure 5 & 6. Implicit (left) and Explicit Attitudes (right) Towards Transgender People Across Religious Identities




Figure 7 & 8. Implicit (left) and Explicit Attitudes (right) Towards Gay People Across Racial Groups




Figure 9 & 10. Implicit (left) and Explicit Attitudes (right) Towards Gay People Across Religious Identities
