Eligibility criteria

- □ Candidate has already completed the minimum requirements for subspecialty certification of the applicant's mandatory accreditation body (e.g., for Canadian applicants, the mandatory accreditation body is the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada)
- □ Program director supports candidate's application
- □ Research project supervisor has been defined and he/she agrees to supervise the applicant
- □ Applicant is eligible for postgraduate training at McGill University
- □ Candidate has applied to postgraduate training online through the Postgraduate Medical Education website: <u>http://www.mcgill.ca/pgme/admissions</u>.
- Program director and research project supervisor guarantee that the applicant will have at least 70% of protected time for research activities during the bursary period

IMPORTANT NOTE:

- 1) The Alan Ross Academic Bursary Award requires 70% research time throughout a two-year training period.
- 2) Candidates seeking subspecialty certification will not be eligible for this bursary as the clinical time throughout a program may not satisfy the minimum requirements of an accrediting body. For example, for the Adolescent Medicine program the Royal College of Surgeons and Physicians of Canada requires the equivalent of 15 months (out of a total 24 months) of direct clinical experience.
- Alan Ross Academic Bursary application deadline: <u>March 1st (annually)</u>
 International applicants must apply for postgraduate training by the <u>March 1st (annually)</u> deadline.
