Global Child Health Program: Year-end report 2015-2016

 - b. Pediatric resident electives
 - c. Advanced Curriculum in Pediatric Global Health

Projects and Expenses:

- 1. Research Capacity Building at CHUK
- a. MicroResearch training program: longitudinal training and mentorship

CHUK has identified research as a partnership priority, and assistance finding and applying for research funding in particular. Micro Research is a longitudinal training and mentorship program. It involves a 2-week training program on research methodology in the host country. There is also a train-the-trainer component, where experienced researchers in the host country are invited to assist in teaching the course. These trainers can then go on to train more participants.

Small grants are available to the participants to complete their research. Mentoring is available to assist with proposal writing for other grants, execution of the project, and manuscript writing and publishing.

In February 2016, a MicroResearch training course was held at CHUK. Drs. Bob Bortolussi and Noni MacDonald traveled to Kigali, Rwanda to deliver the course. They were assisted by Dr. Lisine Tuyisenge (chief of Pediatrics, CHUK) and 6 Rwandan lecturers/coaches. A total of 26 participants completed the course. This included 7 pediatricians, 9 pediatric nurses, 2 Quality Assurance personnel, and 1 each of general practitioner (MD), pharmacist, lab technician, physiotherapy, nutritionist, data manager, psychologist, and psychiatrist.

Four research teams and projects were developed during the 2-week course:

1) Resurgence of malaria with severe complications among Pediatric patients admitted in Kigali University Teaching Hospital/CHUK?

- 2) Does Traditional practice/medicine use have an impact on outcomes of pediatric patients at CHUK?
- 3) How is transport by ambulance of transferred ill patients from district hospital to CHUK done?
- 4) Are health workers aware of alarming cancer signs?

Four research mentors, one assigned to each project were identified: Drs. Jean-Martin Laberge, Charles Larson, Gillian Morantz, and Jennifer Turnbull.

Grant competitions are held twice a year in May and November. The CHUK teams are aiming to submit for the November deadline.

2a. 2016 Pediatric Global Health Skills Conference

As part of its educational mandate, the GCHP held a 2-day skills conference on June 3rd and 4th, 2016. Healthcare professionals were offered 3 different sessions: Helping Babies Breathe (HBB), Emergency Triage Assessment and Treatment (ETAT), and a Post-travel Debriefing Workshop. Fifteen (15) participants completed HBB, 13 completed ETAT, and 10 completed the post-travel debriefing workshop.
