Several leadership changes are anticipated for the year ahead. Dr. Michael Bond, Psychiatrist-in-Chief at the Jewish General Hospital, will be stepping down, as will Dr. Martin Gauthier Psychiatrist-in-Chief at the Montreal Children's Hospital and chief for the of Child and Division Adolescent Psychiatry. Dr. René Desautels, chief for the Division of Geriatric Psychiatry, also stepped down last spring. Searches to fill these positions have been initiated. We have

also posted the position of Postgraduate Program Director for Geriatric Psychiatry.

Finally, you should have all heard by now that I have decided not to renew my mandate as Chair of the Department. A search committee chaired by Mara Ludwig, Associate Dean of Faculty Affairs, has been assembled and your input will be solicited. 


Hot off the Press


A book for children of parents with borderline personality disorder *The Weather House,* has been written by Dr. Ronald
