Speech-Language Pathologists are health professionals who have expertise in the assessment and treatment of a broad range of area related to communication and swallowing including:

- Speech delays and disorders
- Language delays and disorders

- Cognitive-communicative disorders
- Pre-literacy and literacy skills
- Aural rehabilitation

Our faculty members carry out innovative and crossdisciplinary research in collaboration with investigators from a wide range of fields, including computer science, education, engineering, laryngology, linguistics, music, neuroscience and psychology.



Our School offers research degrees including the **Master of Science (with thesis)** and the **Doctor of Philosophy in Communication Sciences and Disorders**. Post-doctoral fellowships are also available to investigate speech and language mechanisms and disorders.

Students will have access to our state-of-the-art facilities for projects ranging from infant speech perception to the neural bases of speech, language and emotion.
