## WEB REGISTRATION VIA MINERVA

Minerva is McGill's new web-based information system providing service to students, faculty, and staff.

Students register and make course changes on the web at <a href="http://www.mcgill.ca/minerva-students">http://www.mcgill.ca/minerva-students</a>. (Music practical

instruction is the only exception.)

PLEASE NOTE: the dates published in this document were accurate as of February 2002. The transition from MARS (McGill's previous registration system) to Minerva may, however, result in some changes especially with relation to the various registration activities. Users should verify opening dates and times on the web <a href="http://www.mcgill.ca/minerva-students">http://www.mcgill.ca/minerva-students</a>.

Registration for the Fall 2002 and Winter 2003 terms will be done via Minerva during the registration dates as published on <a href="http://www.mcgill.ca/minerva-students">http://www.mcgill.ca/minerva-students</a>.

Students will be charged a late registration fee during the late registration period.

To avoid the late registration fee students must access the website and register for at least one course for the Fall term. Courses may be added until the end of the course change period without penalty.

## PERMANENT CODE (code permanent)

Most students who were registered at McGill in the last academic year will already have their Permanent Code on record. It will also be on record for all incoming students who provided a verifiable Permanent Code during the application/admission process. For more information, refer to "Permanent Code (code permanent)" on page 27 of this Calendar or the Web http://www.mcgill.ca/students.

Students who have not already provided their Permanent Code or submitted Permanent Code documentation to the Admissions, Recruitment and Registrar's Office should take note of the following.

Returning students will not be permitted to register if they have not provided the information and/or documents necessary to obtain or verify their Permanent Code. Late registration fees which may result will not be waived.

**New students** beginning in September (or January) have until October 15 (or February 15) to submit their Permanent Code Data Form along with the information and/or documents necessary to obtain or verify the Permanent Code.

Failure to provide necessary documents may result in the student being assessed at a higher fee rate, and/or the student's admission to, or registration in, the University being rescinded.
