# DAVID R. KING, MD, FACS

**Dr. David R. King** received his medical degree from the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine. He is a fellow of the American College of Surgeons. Dr. King is an Associate Professor of Surgery at the Harvard Medical School as an attending trauma surgeon at the Massachusetts General Hospital in the Division of Trauma, Emergency Surgery, and Surgical Critical Care. Dr. King is also currently a Colonel in the US Army with 18 years of service and currently attached to the Joint Special Operations Command with multiple combat deployments.

Dr. King has research interests in the areas of prehospital bleeding control, intracavitary hemorrhage control, non-invasive monitoring for trauma, trauma triage, and human athletic performance. He has multiple federally funded biomedical research grants. Dr. King is one of the principle inventors of ResQFoam, in addition to several inventions and multiple patents on medical devices. He has over 250 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters reflecting these research interest. He speaks regularly at regional, national, and international surgical conferences. He is on the editorial board of multiple peer-reviewed journals and is a regular reviewer for all major trauma and surgical journals. Dr. King was one of the primary drivers of the Stop The Bleed campaign, advocating for public access hemorrhage control since 2011. Dr. King is also known for his role in the 2013 Boston Marathon bombings where, after completing the marathon in 3 hrs 12 min, he ran to the hospital and operated on the casualties for days afterwards. Dr King also testified in the federal death penalty trial of Dzhokhar Tsarnaev where a conviction was obtained. Dr. King takes special pride in taking care of those who protect us, including US military, police, first responders, and other similar constituents.

When not working at the hospital or with the military, Dr. King trains as an ultra-endurance athlete. He has completed dozens of marathons and 11 Ironman triathlons. He races regularly around the world.

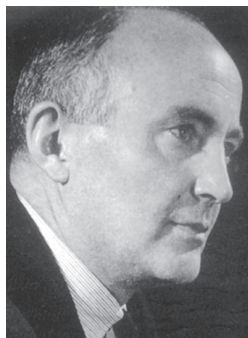

## DR. H. ROCKE ROBERTSON

**DR. ROBERTSON** was born in Victoria, British Columbia in 1912. In 1932 he graduated with his BSc and 1936, he obtained his MD CM from McGill University. His post graduate surgical training was under the direction of Dr. Fraser B. Gurd. He played an important role in the care of the wounded. He served in the Medical Services of the Canadian Army between 1940-1945 and reached the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

His interest in wound infections led to his work in surgical infections and a data collection system. He became the first Chairman in the Department of Surgery at the University of British Columbia. Dr. Robertson returned to his Alma Mater

in 1959 as Surgeon-in-Chief at the Montreal General Hospital, as well as Professor and Chairman of the McGill Department of Surgery. In 1962, Dr. Robertson was appointed Principal and Vice Chancellor at McGill University. Under his leadership, many of the buildings on the campus were built including the McIntyre Medical Sciences Building. He has received many awards and honorary degrees in recognition of all facets of his brilliant career.

The visiting professorship in trauma was established in 1996 in recognition of Dr. Robertson's many accomplishments in the service of The Montreal General Hospital, the Department of Surgery, and McGill University.
