1. Please describe your initiative, including details on when and where it will take place.

We are a graduate student committee across departments representing different student organizations that support underrepresented students on campus. We are planning a research symposium entitled "Out Loud: The Queer Voices in Research Symposium" for queer graduate students across McGill to present their research to the larger McGill community. This symposium will take place in the Thomson House from 12-5pm on June 3rd, with a happy hour following from 5-7pm. Presenters will have the option of 10 minute, 3 minute or poster presentations. We will have 4 thematic platform presentations with a combination of 3 and 10 minute talks, including one focused on sustainability

2. Please describe how your initiative is sustainability focused and how it will be managed sustainably.

Our symposium incorporates sustainability by highlighting queer voices in higher education and research, promoting sustainability focused research, and incorporating sustainable practices into the program. The goal of this project is to provide a platform to showcase queer graduate students' work and through this expand the idea of what it means to be a researcher at McGill and the larger community. We also hope to build a community across McGill for queer graduate students. Through these aims we addresses the goal of social sustainability. We are also including a session during the symposium focused on research in sustainability to highlight advances in this field. Further we hope to act on these ideas of sustainability by using rouseble plates, cure and sutlery for our coffee break and bappy hour.

This symposium provides a space for McGill queer graduate students to gain presentation experience, network and build relationships for future collaborations and support. By working with groups that represent other underrepresented groups in research, we will further build community and support for graduate students across McGill that may face additional challenges during their studies. We hope to build off this and create an intersectional working group that connects existing graduate student groups from downtown and Macdonald campuses for future collaboration including a larger and more diverse symposium. Since this is the inaugural symposium, we expect that there will be approximately 60 participants (presenters and audience members) attending this event. We are planning advertising through McGill email (our collaborators' listserves), post on McGill student facebook pages (entering classes, events, MacDonald Graduate students, etc) and posters in both downtown and Macdonald Campus.

We are hoping to use the funds from SPF to pay for most of the room rental at Thomson House, we were given an estimated cost of 410.00 plus taxes for use of a room for the day. As a student run symposium, we are hoping to gain funding from several sources to be able to provide the best experience for presenters and audience members. As such, we will provide a coffee break and happy hour snacks for 60 catered by Thomson House. Additionally, in recognition of the hard work our presenters put into their presentations we are awarding 6 presentation prizes.
